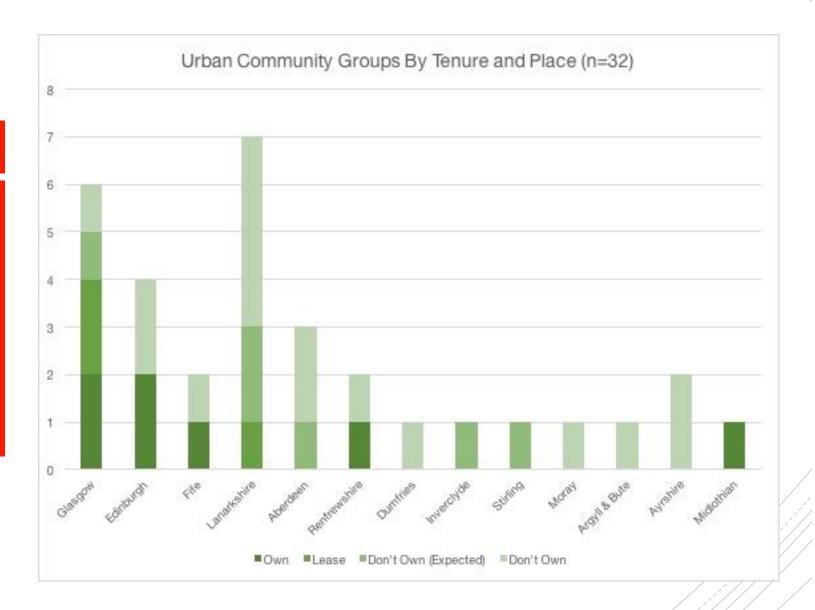
- Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015

- What land uses are of greatest interest?

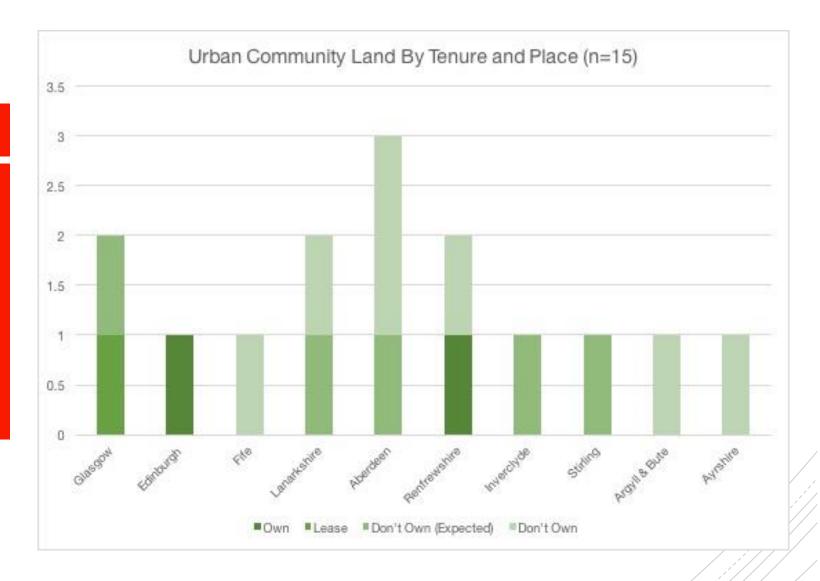

- Membership defined by postcode
- At least ten members, at least 75% of drawn from defined postcode
